Online Safety workshops with Lincolnshire Stay Safe Partnership



Swallows listened carefully and worked hard to think about what to do if messages come through in any games they play online including Roblox and Minecraft. They learned the importance of telling a trusted adult, who can help them to report negativity and

to not message back. We also thought about age ratings, thinking about which games and apps are made for children and which are not suitable.

Owls Class enjoyed a workshop on online safety, where they learned how to protect their identity online and understand the difference between information that can be shared and information that should be kept private. As part of the activity, the children designed their own superheroes. On the superhero's cape, they wrote examples of personal information that needs to be protected, while around the superhero they added information that is safe to share.

In Swans, we became Lincolnshire Online Wizards! We split into the four Hogwarts houses.

Gryffindor, Slytherin, Ravenclaw and Hufflepuff and learned how to tackle uncomfortable online scenarios maturely, sensibly, and safely. Working together in our houses, we used our knowledge, teamwork, and good judgement to make positive choices online and become true Lincolnshire Online Wizards!

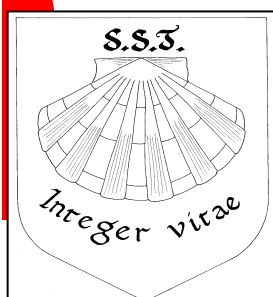
