

Maths:

This term will be the first time where shape will be incorporated into our maths lessons.

Children will begin by identifying acute, right-angled, obtuse and reflex angles, realising how many degrees there are in each turn, before measuring angles accurately with a protractor. This will lead them into identifying angles within a triangle and any quadrilateral before reaching our final goal of using translation and reflection of any given shape in all four quadrants.

The children will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of arithmetic and reasoning.

English:

Children will continue to develop their grammar, punctuation and spelling skills through writing activities in a range of genres which include suspense and fictional texts. We will use our class novel, 'The Curse of the Maya' as a stimulus to draft, revise, edit and publish written pieces of work.

RE:

Children will focus on aspects of worship across different faiths. They will explore what worship is, what it means to religious believers and how believers worship differently. Children will consider different forms of worship and work independently, and with others, to share their learning about worship through music, art and objects.

DT:

This exciting DT project will see children explore the work of set designers. In the first instance, a set designer that works in theatre; and in the second instance, a maker that creates sets for animation. Pupils will then go on to explore how they can create their own model set, inspired by a creative stimulus (poetry, film or music).

Who Let the Gods Out!

History:

Children will uncover the mysteries of the Maya civilisation by studying an incredible unit of learning. They will start by taking a trip deep into the rainforests of Central America as they explore Maya ruins. From there, they will embark on a journey which will help them uncover the life, society and civilisation of both ancient and Modern Maya people.

Science:

Children will discover all about living things and their habitats, where they will learn about the process of reproduction and the life cycles of plants, mammals, insects and birds. They will explore reproduction in different plants, including different methods of pollination and asexual reproduction.

PSE:

Children will study an incredibly important unit of learning titled VIPs (Very Important People) which will focus on relationships. They will identify who their VIPs are within their families and friendship groups and how important kindness and respect are within these relationships. They will also look at secrets and dares as well as healthy and unhealthy relationships.
